MercyFirst is pleased to announce that the RTS Family Foundation, under the leadership of Richard and Margaret Santulli has donated \$125,000 to support its Preventive Service Programs in Brooklyn and Nassau County. These programs provide family support services, advocacy and referral for 310 families every day who are in danger of having their children removed and placed in foster care. MercyFirst has been operating Preventive Service programs for New York City since 1975 and since 1986 in Nassau County.

MercyFirst's range of programs include Family Support and After-School Programs, Foster Homes and Adoption Services, Community Group Homes, Campus-based Residential Treatment and Medical and Mental Health Services, as well as the innovative Bridges to the Future, a range of specialized support services offering skills training and hands-on work experience help our teen and young adult clients learn to be self-sufficient.
