MercyFirst Youth Speaker, Shoshana shared her experiences of growing up in foster care and about the support and guidance she has received from MercyFirst.


# Angel of Hope Gala Raises Critical Funds for Children and Families






## START with Hope Teen Parent and Child Group Home Opens in Suffolk County

We are excited to announce the opening of our new 8-bed Teen Parent and Child Group Home on Long Island as part of MercyFirst's **START with Hope** program. This program for unaccompanied refugee children provides young mothers and their babies with the care and support they need to navigate pregnancy and their new role in a new country.

The **START with Hope** program provides culturally competent, trauma-informed, strengths-based services to ensure the safety, support, and the physical, social and emotional well-being of minors who arrive in the US without a parent or guardian, and who are fleeing areas of extreme poverty, violence, sexual exploitation, drug-related gang activity, and human trafficking, until they are reunified with a sponsor family.
